Candidates for this role must have a recognised Occupational Therapy qualification (BSc or MSc), must be registered as a practitioner with the Health Care Professions Council (HCPC) and be a member of the Royal College of Occupational Therapists. Experience of post graduate training in Ayres Sensory Integration is preferred.

Candidates must have proven experience working as an Occupational Therapist with children and / or young people with complex learning disabilities to be considered for this position.
